

Rosary to the Interior: for the Purification of the Church

It is obvious that the Catholic Church is in the midst of a very deep crisis. At times, it doesn't even appear to be the same Church that was here only a hundred years ago. Division and confusion grip her members; darkness and evil seem to have found their way among the hierarchy and the laity alike. Catholics are in need of Divine intervention. This is something that was recognized years ago by the late James Larson whose solution was a prayer initiative called Rosary to the Interior: for the Purification of the Church.

Late Mr. Larson had some success locally with this prayer initiative but the whole thing has been largely abandoned ever since his sudden death in 2020.

Inspired by Mr. Larson's work and love for the Church, a small group of faithful Catholics from around the world gathered in a Telegram Community called Pebbles. They decided to devote their time and effort into making the Rosary to the Interior initiative spread globally. Each member works with their own local parishes to try and organize this prayer event.

The Rosary initiative is itself fairly straightforward: Pebbles aim for Catholic laity and clergy around the world to gather in their churches and chapels in order to pray the Rosary in unison on February 2.

The intention of this Rosary is the internal purification of all the members of the Church, the faithful and the clergy alike. The aim is to ask God, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, to purify our hearts and minds of all sins, evils and compromises with the world so that we can all truly bring the Light of Christ to all nations.
